Arkansas Child Care Orientation Training- (CCOT) 10 -hour course

This training is recommended that all child caregivers who have little or no previous experience child care training complete this basic orientation training within one year of employment in a child care setting.

Family Child Care Provider (FCCP) 8 – hour course

Family Child Care Provider is basic orientation training for family child care providers. It is required for newly licensed and registered providers within the first six months of being licensed or registered. It is also useful for providers who would like a refresher course in the basics of family child care.

Pre – K Frameworks Handbook (Pre- K FH) 30- hour course

This class is designed to train early childhood professionals in the use of the Arkansas Early Childhood Education (AECE) Frameworks Handbook. Pre – K FH training helps teachers use this document effectively. Also included is training curriculum, knowing children, classroom environment, topics of study approach, planning and implementing activities, family and community involvement, assessment and observation, and professional ethics. This basic course provides the foundation for literacy, math, science and social – emotional learning.

Pre- K Early Literacy Learning in Arkansas (Pre- K Ella) 30- hour course

The goal of Pre- K Ella is to provide skills and resource to early childhood educators to help them deliver balanced literacy opportunities which provide a strong literacy foundation for school and like success to young children in Arkansas.
